IV. Orientation (Required)

All students must:

- meet all prerequisites (consult the 2007 – 2009 ISU Bulletin).
- complete orientation requirements as Freshmen and Sophomores, or as Transfer students.
- have pre-student teaching practicum experiences at both primary and intermediate levels to meet the Department of Education certification requirements.
- meet English Proficiency requirement of a "C" or better in both English 150 and 250.
- meet and maintain the requirements for admission into the Teacher Education program.
- fulfill the foreign language (flng) requirement for graduation (3 years of high school flng in one language or 1 year of college level flng in one language).
- meet one of high school rank $\geq 50\%$ or ACT ≥ 19 or SAT-I 910.
- meet the Praxis-I exam requirement prior to applying for entry into the teacher education program. Praxis-I scores: 522 composite score with no one score in either area of Reading, Writing, or Math, below 170. Applications for the teacher education program are due the first week of the fall or spring semester while enrolled in C I 245/268.
- meet the requirements of the Candidate Assessment System. "C" in all C I, Sp Ed, and HD FS courses, no "U's" on Standard Assessments, and "C-" in all Teacher Ed. supporting courses. Supporting courses include: Areas of Specialization (Sp Ed requires a minimum "C"), additional add-on endorsements, and the Related Methods.
- meet the Praxis-II exam requirement in order to be recommended for teacher licensure prior to graduation. Exam scores on Test: 0011 of 151, or Test: 0014 of 142.
- Most specializations within the EI Ed major are met with 128.5 credits because up to 9 credits may be dual listed to meet other requirements. In the case for those in Health Studies, Instructional Strategist I (Sp Ed) and foreign languages; 131.5, 134.5 and 133.5 credits are required, respectively.
