All students must:

- meet all prerequisites (consult the 2005 – 2007 ISU Bulletin).
- complete orientation requirements as Freshmen and Sophomores, or as Transfer students.
- have pre-student teaching practicum experiences at **both pre-primary and primary levels** to meet the Department of Education certification requirements.
- meet English Proficiency requirement of a "C" or better in both English 104 and 105.
- meet and maintain the requirements for admission into the Teacher Education program.
- **fulfill the foreign language (flng) requirement** for graduation (3 years of high school flng in one language or 1 year of college level flng in one language).
- must meet one of high school rank $\geq 50\%$ or ACT ≥ 19 .
- must meet the Praxis-I exam requirements of a 522 composite score with no one score in either area of Reading, Writing, or Math, below 170; prior to applying for entry into the teacher education program. Applications for entry into the teacher education program are due the first week of the fall or spring semester while enrolled in C I 245/268.
- must be admitted as a first semester freshmen at ISU as an ECE major in order to participate in the 4 year plan program.

- must adhere to a strictly enforced sequence of courses that will dictate that student teaching be completed during the 4th semester after enrolling in C I 245/268.
- Post-Bachelor's teacher education candidates must have graduated from previous institution with a 2.5 or better GPA.

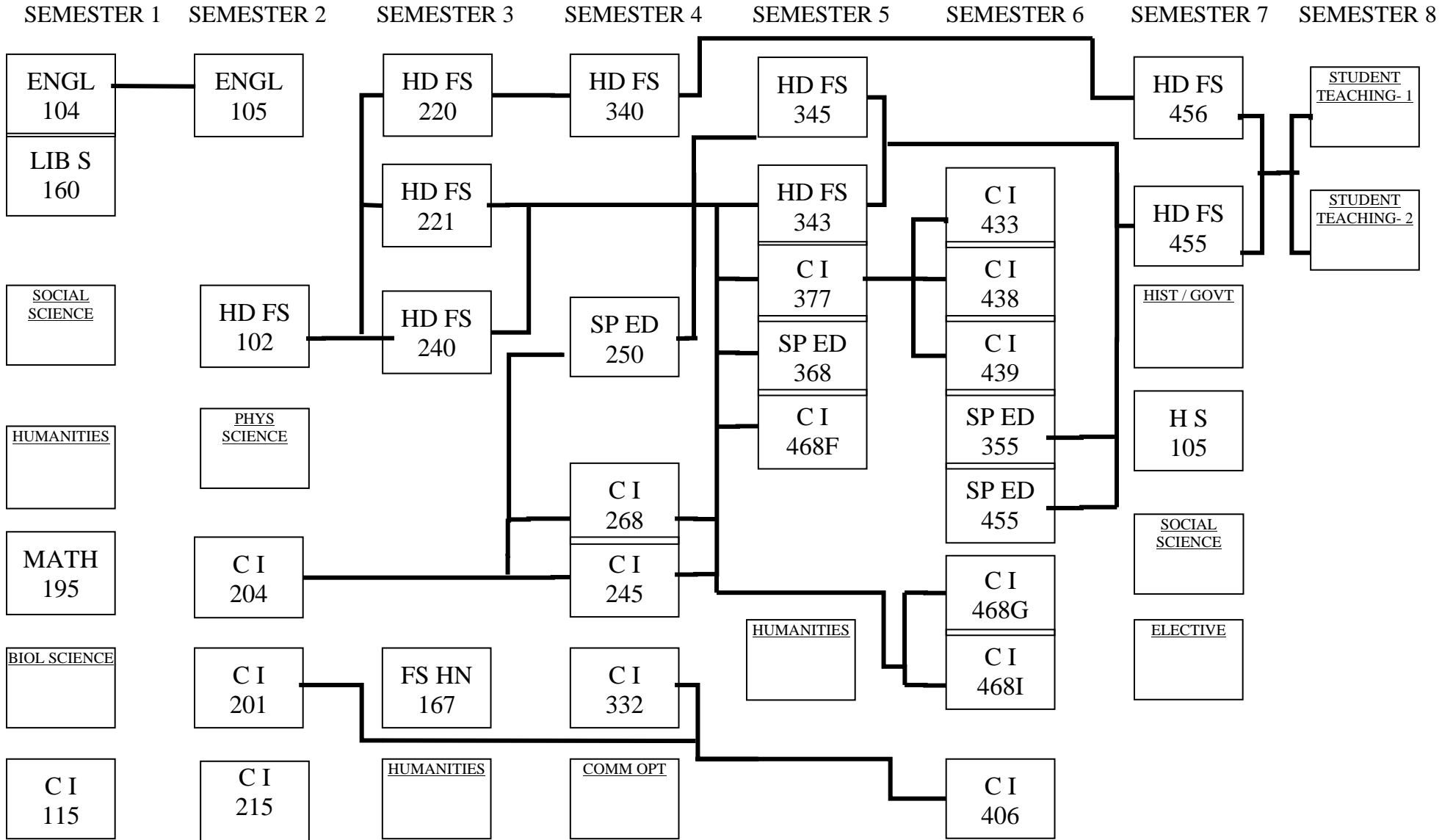
